Quick Overview: 6 Days in Tuscany

Day	Destination	Highlights
1	Arrival + Villa Time	Settle in, pizza night, pool + views
2	Florence	Duomo, Uffizi, Ponte Vecchio
3	Cortona	Shopping, views, dinner at La Bucaccia
4	Siena, Volterra + Winery	Wine tasting at Poggio Rubino
5	Free Day	Cooking class, relaxing, Cortona
6	Montepulciano + Pienza	Brunello tasting, linens, cheese tasting

Day-by-Day Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival + Villa Time

- Arrive in Tuscany via train or rental car
- Check into your villa (we stayed at Villa Caprile)
- Unpack, settle in, and enjoy poolside views
- Group pizza night with wine

Day 2: Florence Day Trip

- Drive or train into Florence early
- Visit the Duomo (book in advance)
- Explore Uffizi Gallery or Accademia
- Lunch and shopping in the historic center
- Return to villa by evening

Day 3: Cortona

- Sleep in and enjoy a slow morning
- Drive into Cortona
- Visit shops and wine bars
- Dinner at La Bucaccia
- Walk through Cortona at sunset

Day 4: Siena, Volterra + Wine Tasting

- Head out early to Siena

- Grab coffee, visit Piazza del Campo
- Drive to Volterra for a walk + lunch
- Afternoon wine tasting at Poggio Rubino winery near Montalcino
- Return to villa

Day 5: Free Day

- Pool time and villa relaxation
- Optional morning stroll into Cortona
- Afternoon Tuscan cooking class
- Dinner at the villa

Day 6: Montepulciano + Pienza

- Morning drive to Montepulciano
- Visit a Brunello winery for tasting
- Explore the town and shop for leather
- Stop in Pienza for lunch and cheese shops
- Final group dinner back at the villa

Where We Stayed: Villa Caprile

- Gorgeous views over the countryside
- 6 bedrooms, large pool, well-equipped kitchen
- 10 minutes from Cortona
- Highly recommend for groups of 10–12

Tip: Book early—many villas are reserved 6–9 months in advance.

Getting There & Around

- Fly into Rome or Florence
- Train to Camucia-Cortona station
- Rent cars in Florence or at Rome airport
- Use Google Maps, but beware of small, narrow roads

Note: Don't rent low-clearance cars—some roads to villas are rough!

Planning Tips for Groups

- Assign a point person for bookings
- Use Splitwise to track shared expenses
- Choose one or two "group meals" out; cook the rest in
